Parenting Plan:

CHOOSE ONLY <u>ONE</u> OF THE THREE PLANS BELOW:

(A Standard Parenting Plan has been included in this packet. Safety focused and Relocation parenting plans can be found on the Florida Court's website at <u>www.flcourts.gov</u> under the "Self-Help Information" tab.)

All attempts should be made to file a Parenting Plan <u>signed by both</u> <u>parents</u>. You may file a Parenting Plan at a later time in order to secure both signatures or obtain an agreement through mediation. A Parenting Plan must be filed in your case before you are able to obtain a Final Judgment. If the whereabouts of the other parent is unknown or you are unable to reach and agreement, you may choose the parenting plan which best fits your circumstances and file it with the court.

INCLUDED IN THIS PACKET:

(Form 12.995(a)- Standard Parenting Plan)- This form should be used in the development of a standard Parenting Plan. This plan should be used when there are <u>no issues with the safety of the child(ren) around your spouse or issues</u> with relocation).

(Form 12.995(b)- Safety Focused Parenting Plan)- This plan should be used in cases when you feel your <u>child(ren) cannot be safely alone with the</u> <u>other parent</u> or if you believe shared parental responsibility presents a detriment to the child(ren).

(Form 12.995(c)- Relocation/Long Distance Parenting Plan- *This form should be used in the development of a Parenting Plan <u>when you are</u> <u>planning to relocate your or the child(ren)'s principal residence more than 50 miles</u> <u>from the principal place of residence.</u>*
